Delhi, where Maulana Azad, was laid to rest was the emotional centre of his life. Nearly 48 years earlier, in April 1910, he had written in *al-Nadwa*:

No better person could lead the funeral prayer of a freedom fighter. The body was laid to rest in the area between Red Fort and the Mosque where the bitterest resistance to British power had taken place in 1857 and which was totally devastated by the British. The place selected for his burial was unconsciously symbolic of his life struggle.
