They explored iconic landmarks such as the Red Fort, Pradhanmantri Sangrahalay (Prime Minister's Museum), and the National School of Drama. At Delhi University, they engaged in interactive sessions with Dr. Sanjeev Tiwari on India's democratic tradition and Dr. Hitesh Shankar on the journey from independence to prosperity over 75 years.





The delegates also marvelled at the beauty of the Taj Mahal and the historical significance of the Red Fort in Agra. They the National visited Museum in New Delhi, which impressive houses an collection of 33,000 objects accumulated over six decades. Additionally, a special evening concert titled "A Song Eternal Lata Mangeshkar" paid tribute to the legendary singer, whose melodious voice transcends language and cultural barriers.

The delegates further visited the Mahatma Gandhi Antarrashtriya Hindi Vishwa Vidyalaya in Wardha, Maharashtra. They attended sessions led by experts that emphasized the importance of Hindi in Nagpur, Maharashtra.
