## Introduction and Synopsis

The Indian Council for Cultural Relations was formally set up in 1950, with the primary objective of establishing, reviving and strengthening cultural relations and mutual understanding between India and other countries. Its aims, as enunciated in the Memorandum of Association, are:

- To participate in the formulation and implementation of policies and programmes relating to India's cultural relations with other countries;
- To foster and strengthen cultural relations and mutual understanding between India and other countries;
- To *establish* and *develop* relations with national and international organizations in the field of culture.

The Council has worked steadily to attain these objectives.

The major activities of the Council include:

- \* Administration of scholarship schemes for overseas students on behalf of the Government of India, other agencies and to supervise the welfare of international students;
- Grant of scholarships to foreign students to learn Indian dance and music;
- Exchange of Exhibitions;
- \* Organization of and participation in international seminars and symposia;
- Participation in major cultural festivals abroad;
- Organization of 'Festivals of India' abroad;
- Exchange of groups of performing artistes;
- Organization of lecture-demonstrations by performing artistes abroad:

- To maintain the Distinguished Visitors Programme, under which eminent personalities from abroad are invited to India and experts from home are sent abroad to deliver lectures on issues of mutual interest;
- To establish and maintain Chairs for Indian Studies abroad;
- The presentation of books, audio-visual material, art objects and musical instruments at institutions abroad;
- To provide the Secretariat for the Jawaharlal Nehru Award for International Understanding; Organization of the annual Maulana Azad Memorial Lecture and the Maulana Azad Essay Competition;
- The publication of books and journals for distribution in India and abroad;
- The Maintenance of Indian Cultural Centres abroad;
- The maintenance of a well-stocked library and the manuscripts of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad;
- The digitization of rare manuscripts;

- To undertake projects on behalf of the Ministry of External Affairs.

The activities of the Council are decided and approved by its Governing Body.

## Activities of the Council

## i) Scholarship and Welfare of International Students

The Council administered approximately 1300 scholarships during 2006-07 under various schemes for foreign students to pursue under-graduate, post-graduate and doctoral programmes as well as professional courses such as Engineering, Pharmacy, Accountancy, Business Administration and Management, etc. The thrust of the scholarship programme is towards developing nations with a special focus on India's neighbours. The Council is also responsible for implementing a special scheme for Afghan students whereby 500 slots are provided to Afghanistan on an annual basis following an announcement made by the Hon'ble Prime Minister in 2005.

Details of the scholarship schemes administered / handled by the International Scholarship Division during 2006-07 along with slots allotted under each scheme and its utilization are given at Annexure-I.

The ICCR in collaboration with Delhi University organized an Orientation Programme on August 28, 2006 at the Delhi University Auditorium for the benefit of newly arrived foreign students.

To solve the problems faced by the foreign students studying in India, an International Students Advisors Meeting was organized by the Council on September 2, 2006. The meeting was chaired by Dr. Karan Singh, President, ICCR. Foreign Students Advisors (FSA) from 20 Universities participated in the meeting. Apart from the FSAs, representatives of the Ministries of Home Affairs, Human Resources Development, External Affairs and the Association of Indian Universities attended the meeting.

The XIVth International Students Cultural Festival was organized by the ICCR at the Siri Fort Auditorium, New Delhi, on December 30, 2006 in which students from 16 countries presented cultural items.

During the period under reference five summer camps were arranged in May-June 2006 and six winter camps during December 2006-January 2007 for the benefit of the ICCR scholars.

## ii) Indian Cultural Centres Abraod

The Primary objective of the Council is to establish, revive and strengthen cultural relations and mutual understanding between India and other countries. In order to promote awareness and appreciation of India's composite cultural heritage abroad, the Council has set up 18 Indian Cultural Centres and two sub-Centres in different parts of the world. The Centres are located at Cairo (Egypt), Berlin (Germany), Port Louis (Mauritius), Paramaribo (Suriname), Georgetown (Guyana), Jakarta (Indonesia), Sub-Centre, Bali (Indonesia), Moscow (Russian Federation), London (U.K.), Almaty (Kazakhstan), Tashkent (Uzbekistan), Durban and Johannesburg (South Africa), Port of Spain (Trinidad & Tobago), Colombo (Sri Lanka), Dushanbe (Tajikistan), Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia), Suva (Fiji) and Tokyo (Japan). The Sub-Centres are at Bali (Indonesia) and Lautoka (Fiji). In line with its own expanding mandate as well as in compliance with the recommendation of the Standing Committee on the External Affairs, proposals to open new centers at several capitals including such as Kathmandu, Washington, Kabul, Beijing and Tehran were actively pursued.

The existing Cultural Centres run by the Council have yielded rich dividends and have been recognized as important instruments to promote India's cultural diplomacy. In particular, they play a pivotal role in showcasing Indian cultural traditions abroad.

## iii) Chairs of Indian Studies abroad

The Council is maintaining several Chairs of Indian Studies abroad to teach Indian languages and other related subjects. Presently 20 chairs are being maintained to teach Hindi, Sanskrit, Tamil, Modern Indian History and Indian Civilization in Paramaribo (Suriname), Budapest (Hungary), Moscow (Russia), Seoul (South Korea), Warsaw (Poland), Port of Spain (Trinidad & Tobago) Sofia (Bulgaria), Bucharest (Romania), Beijing (China), Madrid (Spain), Bangkok (Thailand), Paris (France), Osh (Kyrghystan), Tashkent (Uzbekistan), Brussels (Belgium) and Moka (Mauritius). In addition, the Council is maintaining Rotating Chairs in Ulaanbaatar (Mongolia) and Pennsylvania (USA). In addition, the Council has also approved the setting up of five rotating chairs three in Hindi and two in Modern Indian History) at Warsaw (Poland), four rotating chairs in Germany and one Chair each in Mongolia, Lithuania, Afghanistan and Kyrghystan. The Council has also signed an MOU with Sciences Po, Paris (France) to depute a Professor of Indian Economics on a short-term basis.

## iv) Conferences and Seminars

During the year 2006-07, the Council organized two major international seminars. A seminar on Indology was held at the Vilnius University, Lithuania, and another on "Indo-Thai Historical and Cultural Lineages: The Contemporary Scenario", was organized at Bangkok (Thailand). In addition, the Council collaborated with several organizations for major international seminars in India. These included the Interfaith Harmony Conclave which was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Prime Minister as well as the SAARC Literary Conference to mark the 14<sup>th</sup> SAARC Summit in New Delhi. The collaboration offered by ICCR was in tune with its policy to support important conferences and seminars involving a significant foreign participation.

## v) Outgoing Cultural Delegations

The Council sponsored 78 groups to present varied forms of Indian dance and music abroad. The performance rendered by them included classical, contemporary, tribal and folk art forms. Priority was accorded for participation in major cultural festivals so as to generate greater interest in Indian cultural strengths and accomplishments. In some of these countries, the visiting Indian artists also gave lecture-demonstrations for the benefit of the local people.

## vi) Incoming Cultural Delegations and Cultural Performances in India

The Council hosted 34 groups of performing artistes from abroad. These groups performed in several cities of India. With a view to providing a platform to talented and upcoming artists in India itelf, the Council also organized the performances of the artistes empanelled with it under its 'Retrospective' and 'Horizon' series. The Retrospective series is meant for artistes who have already been sponsored abroad for performances and the Horizon series is meant for those artistes who are yet to be sponsored. In addition, the Council organized special events, such as the Sufi Music Festival at Srinagar, the Malhar Festival, the Festival of Music and Dance and the sprit of Tanjore - A Festival of Dance and Music.

## vii) Foreign Cultural Centres

The Council continued to administer the British Council Libraries and coordinate the activities of the Foreign Cultural Centres in India.

## viii) Distinguished Visitors Programme

Under this programme, the Council invites writers, scholars, intellectuals, opinion-makers, academics, artistes, etc., from abroad to expose them to the various facets of Indian life and society. The distinguished visitors found this programme extremely useful and expressed their desire to visit India again.

## ix) Outgoing Visitors

In keeping with its effort to foster and strengthen cultural relations and mutual understanding between India and other countries, the Council also facilitates visits of Indian scholars, intellectuals, academicians and artistes to foreign countries under the Outgoing Visitors Programme. During the year, the Council sponsored visits by 64 eminent scholars to various parts of world.

## x) Festivals of India

#### The Festival of India in Brussels, Belgium

During the year, the Council coordinated various events for the prestigious Festival of India in Brussels, which took place from 14 October 2006 to 21 January 2007. The Festival in Brussels broadly comprised exhibitions, a film festival, fashion shows, a food festival, seminars and performing arts programmes. The Festival was inaugurated on October 7, 2006 by Dr. Karan Singh, President, ICCR, and Queen Fabiola of Belgium.

The Council sponsored 23 performing art groups for the Festival of India in Brussels. These groups also visited some neighboring European countries for performances. The Exhibition "Tejas"

depicting 1500 years of India's history was the centerpiece of the Festival. The Exhibition brought various aspects of India's cultural heritage and contemporary creativity and also highlighted our capacity to enrich ourselves by absorbing outside influences. "Tejas" was inaugurated by Smt. Sonia Gandhi, Chairperson of UPA, on November 11, 2006.

#### The Festival of India in Japan

The Council is also coordinating various events for the "India-Japan Friendship Year-2007". The Hon'ble Prime Minister of India and the Japanese Prime Minister jointly inaugurated the Festival of India in Japan on December 14, 2006. A joint logo was also launched by them. The Festival in Japan broadly comprised Exhibitions, a Film Festival, Fashion Shows, Food Festivals, Seminars and Performing Arts Groups.

## xi) Publications

The Council has an ambitious publication programme which has grown over the years. The Council publishes six journals in five different languages namely, Indian Horizons and Africa Quarterly (both in English), Gagananchal (Hindi), Papeles de la India (Spanish), Rencontre Avec L' Inde (French) and Thaqafat-ul-Hind (Arabic). These publications have been revamped and are greatly appreciated in their new look and content.

The Council also published a special issue of Gagananchal entitled 150 Years of 1857 which was released by Dr. Karan Singh, President, ICCR.

## xii) Awards and Exhibitions

The Jawaharlal Nehru Award for International Understanding for the year 2005 was conferred on Professor Wangari Muta Maathai, Nobel Laureate from Kenya at a special ceremony held at Ashoka Hall, Rashtrapati Bhavan on 22 March 2007.

## The Maulana Abul Kalam Azad Memorial Lecture

Professor Wangari Muta Maathai delivered the 37th Maulana Abul Kalam Azad Memorial Lecture on 22 March 2007. The theme of her address was "The Role of Leadership in Environmental Protection".

## xiii) Library

The personal collection of books and manuscripts bequeathed by Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the Founder President of the Council, forms the core of the ICCR Library. A catalogue of the manuscripts and personal books of Maulana Azad has been printed in book form in three languages - Arabic, Urdu and Persian. The Council also undertook an exercise to preserve the rare manuscripts available with it. Over the decades the library has grown manifold and presently has more than 50,000 volumes. Over 4000 visitors used the Library during the year 2006-07
