Introduction and Synopsis

The Indian Council for Cultural Relations was formally set up in 1950, with the primary objective of establishing, reviving and strengthening cultural relations and mutual understanding between India and other countries. Its aims, as enunciated in the Memorandum of Association, are:

- To participate in the formulation and implementation of policies and programmes relating to India's cultural relations with other countries;
- To foster and strengthen cultural relations and mutual understanding between India and other countries;
- To establish and develop relations with national and international organizations in the field of culture.

The Council has worked steadily to attain these objectives.

The major activities of the Council include:

- * Administration of scholarship schemes for overseas students on behalf of the Government of India, other agencies and to supervise the welfare of international students;
- Grant of scholarships to foreign students to learn Indian dance and music;
- Exchange of Exhibitions;
- * Organization of and participation in international seminars and symposia;
- Participation in major cultural festivals abroad;
- Organization of 'Festivals of India' abroad;
- Exchange of groups of performing artistes;
- * Organization of lecture-demonstrations by performing artistes abroad;

- * To maintain the Distinguished Visitors Programme, under which eminent personalities from abroad are invited to India and experts from home are sent abroad to deliver lectures on issues of mutual interest;
- * To establish and maintain Chairs for Indian Studies abroad;
- * The presentation of books, audio-visual material, art objects and musical instruments at institutions abroad:
- To provide the Secretariat for the Jawaharlal Nehru Award for International Understanding; Organization of the annual Maulana Azad Memorial Lecture and the Maulana Azad Essay Competition;
- * The publication of books and journals for distribution in India and abroad;
- * The Maintenance of Indian Cultural Centres abroad;
- * The maintenance of a well-stocked library and the manuscripts of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad:
- * The digitization of rare manuscripts;
- * Awarding of Library Fellowships, and;
- * To undertake projects on behalf of the Ministry of External Affairs.

The activities of the Council are decided and approved by its Governing Body.

The Council received Rs 7670.73 Lakhs as Grant-in-Aid from the Ministry of External Affairs for the year 2007-2008.

II. Highlights of the Year 2007-2008

- To commemorate the Birth Anniversary of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the Council organised the XV International Students Cultural Festival on 20th December 2007.
- The Council organised a programme in collaboration with Delhi University Students Union (DUSU) to celebrate Foreign Students Association International Cultural Exchange Programme "Rainbow" on 21st February, 2008. Shri Anand Sharma, Minister of Estate for External Affairs was the Chief Guest on the occasion.
- The Jawaharlal Nehru Award for International Understanding for the year 2006
 was conferred by Hon'ble President of India on H.E. Mr. Luiz Inacio da Siliva,
 President of the Federative Republic of Brazil at a special ceremony held at
 Diwan-I-Am, Taj Mahal Hotel on 4th June 2007.
- The Council published a special issue of its Hindi Quarterly "Gagananchal " for "8th World Hindi Conference 2007", in New York, which was released by Hon'ble Minister of State for External Affairs, Shri Anand Sharma on 13th July 2007.
- ICCR organized for the first time an ambitious SAARC Cultural Festival on the margins of the 14th SAARC Summit in New Delhi. The Festival includes Folklore and Theatre, a Food Festival, a Fashion Show, an Exhibition of Textiles and Handicrafts, an Exhibition of Photographs and a Photo Exhibition of the SAARC Car Rally.

Activities of the Council

i) Scholarship and Welfare of International Students

The Council administered approximately 1350 scholarships during 2007-08 under various schemes for foreign students to pursue under-graduate, post-graduate and doctoral programmes as well as professional courses such as Engineering, Pharmacy, Accountancy, Business Administration and Management, etc. The thrust of the scholarship programme is towards developing nations with a special focus on India's neighbours. Following an announcement made by the Hon'ble Prime Minister in 2005, the Council is also responsible for implementing a special scheme for Afghan students whereby 500 slots are provided to Afghanistan on an annual basis. The activities include:

- (1) <u>Orientation programme</u>: An Orientation programme for the 20 IFS probationers of the 2006 batch was organized by the Council from 9th to 13th April 2007. Lectures / lecture-cum-demonstrations/sight-seeing to Museums, Galleries and Historical places were arranged for them. Lectures were delivered by eminent personalities on traditional & modern culture, art and contemporary Indian arts.
- (2) International Students Festival: To commemorate the Birth Anniversary of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the First Education Minister of Independent India and the Founder President of the ICCR, an "International Students Festival" called "Friendship Through Culture" is organized every year by the Council. The International Students community has always participated enthusiastically in this event by depicting representative aspects of their respective countries' cultures. The Council organised the XV International Students Cultural Festival on 20th December 2007 at Azad Bhavan, I.P. Estate, New Delhi. This Festival was also celebrated in other cities of India and abroad.

Cultural Centres in Kabul (Afghanisatan) and Kathmandu (Nepal) in 2007-08. The Council is presently maintaining 20 Cultural Centres in Cairo (Egypt), Berlin (Germany), Port Louis (Mauritius), Paramaribo (Suriname), Georgetown (Guyana), Jakarta (Indonesia), Moscow (Russian Federation), London (U.K.), Almaty, (Kazakhstan), Tashkent, (Uzbekistan), Durban and Johannesburg (South Africa), Port of Spain (Trinidad & Tobago), Colombo (Sri Lanka), Dushanbe (Tajikistan), Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia), Suva (Fiji), Tokyo (Japan), Kathmandu (Nepal) and Kabul (Afghanistan) as well as 2 sub-Centres at Bali (Indonesia) and Lautoka (Fiji). The Council is also funding the Music & Dance Academy at Dhaka (Bangladesh) and a proposal to open a new center is being pursued. The Council also maintains Chairs of Indian Studies in various Universities and institutions abroad.

iii) Chairs of Indian Studies abroad

Presently the Council is maintaining 20 Chairs of Indian Studies abroad to teach Indian languages and other subjects under the bilateral Cultural exchange programmes, Scheme of Propagation of Hindi Abroad and Council's own programme.

The Chairs being currently maintained encompass the fields of Hindi, Sanskrit, Tamil, Modern Indian History, Indian Civilization and are in functioning in Paramaribo (Suriname) Budapest, (Hungary), Moscow (Russia), Seoul, (South Korea), Warsaw, (Poland), Port of Spain (Trinidad & Tobago), Sofia (Bulgaria), Bucharest (Romania), Beijing (China), Madrid (Spain), Ankara, (Turkey) Bangkok (Thailand), Paris (France), Osh (Kyrghyzstan), Tashkent (Uzbekistan), Brussels (Belgium), Durban (South Africa) and Jalalabad (Afghanistan).

The Council is also maintaining 8 Rotating short term Chairs in the fields of Sanskrit and Buddhist Studies in Ulaanbaatar (Mongolia) Indian Literature in

Pennsylvania (USA), Indian Studies in 3 Universities in Germany, Indian Economy at Science Po, Paris, (France), Indian Studies at Witswatersrand University, Johannesburg, (South Africa) and Humanities at Shenzhen University, Guangzhou (China).

iv) Conferences and Seminars

During the year 2007-08, the Council collaborated with several organizations for major international seminars in India. These included the Interfaith Harmony Conclave, which was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Prime Minister, as well as the SAARC Literary Conference to mark the 14th SAARC Summit in New Delhi. The collaboration offered by ICCR was in tune with its policy to support important conferences and seminars involving significant foreign participation.

v) Outgoing Cultural Delegations

The Council sponsored 64 groups to present varied forms of Indian dance and music abroad. The performance rendered by them included classical, contemporary, tribal and folk art forms. Priority was accorded for participation in major cultural festivals so as to generate greater interest in Indian cultural strengths and accomplishments.

vi) Incoming Cultural Delegations and Cultural Performances in India

FIRST EVER SAARC CULTURAL FESTIVAL

One of the major new activities of the Council was to organize a series of unique performances under the "SAARC Cultural Festival" held on the margins of the 14th SAARC Summit in New Delhi. This included a Festival of Folklore and Theatre, a Food Festival, a Fashion Show, an Exhibition of Textiles and Handicrafts, an Exhibition of Photographs and a Photo Exhibition of the SAARC Car Rally. In addition, leading artists from the SAARC countries were invited to Jaisalmer in December 2006 and an Exhibition of their paintings was inaugurated by the Prime Minister of India during the SAARC Summit. A highlight of the SAARC Cultural Festival was the Fusion Bands event in New Delhi, which attracted huge audiences, especially the young. A special achievement of this Festival was that all SAARC countries participated in all the events.

The Council hosted 33 groups of performing artistes from abroad. These groups performed in several cities of India. With a view to providing a platform to talented and upcoming artists in India itself, the Council also organized the performances of the artistes empanelled with it under its 'Retrospective' and 'Horizon' series. The Retrospective series is meant for artistes who have already been sponsored abroad for performances and the Horizon series is meant for those artistes who are yet to be sponsored. In addition, the Council organized special events, such as the Sufi Music Festival at Srinagar, the Malhar Festival, the Festival of Music and Dance and, The Sprit of Tanjore – A Festival of Dance and Music.

vii) Foreign Cultural Centres

The Council continued to administer the British Council Libraries and coordinate the activities of the Foreign Cultural Centres in India.

viii) Distinguished Visitors Programme

Under this programme, the Council invites writers, scholars, intellectuals, opinion-makers, academics, artistes, etc., from abroad to expose them to the various facets of Indian life and society. The distinguished visitors found this programme extremely useful and expressed their desire to visit India again. Some of the important persons who visited under DVP included Rev. Jesse Jackson from USA, and Mr. Amadou Mahatar, Former DG, UNESCO from Senegal.

ix) Outgoing Visitors

In keeping with its effort to foster and strengthen cultural relations and mutual understanding between India and other countries, the Council also facilitates visits of Indian scholars, intellectuals, academicians and artistes to foreign countries under the Outgoing Visitors Programme (OVP). During the year, the Council sponsored visits by 76 eminent scholars to various parts of world.

x) Festivals of India

Festival of India in Japan

The Council organized "India-Japan Friendship Year-2007". The Festival of India in Japan was inaugurated by both the Prime Ministers of India and Japan on 14th December, 2006. A joint logo was also launched by them. The Festival of India in Japan broadly comprised of Exhibitions, Film Festival, Fashion Show, Food Festivals, Seminars and Performing Arts Group. From April, 2007 to December, 2007, the Council sponsored 19 performing art groups to Japan who also visited other countries in East and South Eastern Region.

Festival of India in Israel

To mark the 15th Anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between India and Israel, as well as to celebrate the 60th anniversary of India's Independence, the Festival "Incredible India", was celebrated in Israel. The event was the first of its kind to take place in Israel.

The Council sponsored a 9-member composite group of Kavita Dwibedi (Odissi) and Purbayan Chatterjee (Sitar) for participation in the above festival.

As part of their chain tour, the group also visited Greece, Jordan, Egypt, Croatia and Malta, during which the group participated in the Jerash Festival in Jordan from 26-30 July 2007 and Corfu Festival in Greece from 23-26 July 2007.

FIRST IBSA DANCE AND MUSIC FESTIVAL

An MoU on cultural cooperation was recently signed between three countries i.e. India, Brazil and South Africa (IBSA). As per the MoU, the First IBSA Dance and Music Festival was organised in Brazil from 26-29 October, 2007 where performing art groups from all the three countries participated. The

Council sponsored a 14-Member Contemporary Dance group of "Sadhya" to Brazil for participation in the festival.

xi) Publications

The Council has an ambitious publication programme, which has grown over the years. The Council brings out six journals in five different languages namely, "Indian Horizons" and "Africa Quarterly" (both English Quarterly), "Gagananchal" (Hindi Quarterly), "Papeles de la India" (Spanish, bi-annual), Rencontre Avec L' Inde" (French bi-annual) and "Thaqafat-ul-Hind" (Arabic Quarterly).

The Council published an special issue of the Hindi Quarterly "Gagananchal" for the "8th World Hindi Conference 2007" in New York, which was released by Hon'ble Minister of State for External Affairs, Shri Anand Sharma on 13th July, 2007.

The Council also published two books entitled the "World Hindi Directory" and "Chetna ka Aatmsangharsh" to coincide with the 8th World Hindi Conference. Besides, ICCR has also published books entitled "Journey of a Legend - Maulana Abul Kalam Azad" in (English edition) and "Munshi Premchand" in Hindi, English and Urdu.

The Council also released the book entitled "Gadar ke 150 Saal" by Dr. Karan Singh, President of ICCR on 17^{th} September 2007 .

The Council participated in the XIIIth Delhi Book Fair from 1-9th September 2007 and in the New Delhi World Book Fair 2008 from 2 –10 Feb, 2008 organized by NBT.

xii) Exhibitions

An important aspect of the Council's work is projection of India abroad, not only to promote India's rich cultural heritage but also her contemporary achievements. The Council regularly sponsors exhibitions of India's contemporary and traditional arts in major festivals and art events abroad.

Under the bilateral cultural exchange programmes with other countries and under its own programme of activities, ICCR sponsors exhibitions of Indian art and crafts to foreign countries and receives exhibitions from abroad for expositions in India.

On the occasion of the observance of the first International Day of Non-Violence at the United Nations on October 2, 2007, ICCR has put up a photographic exhibition titled "Gandhi and Global Non-Violent Awakening" from October 2-12, 2007 at the United Nations Headquarters. Smt. Sonia Gandhi, Hon'ble Member of Parliament and Chairperson of UPA inaugurated the exhibition on 2nd October 2007.

In addition, the Council has an ongoing programme of presenting busts and statues of great Indian leaders for ceremonial installation in other countries.

xiii) AWARDS

The Jawaharlal Nehru Award for International Understanding

The Jawaharlal Nehru Award for International Understanding for the year 2006 was conferred by Hon'ble President of India on H.E. Mr. Luiz Inacio da Siliva, President of the Federative Republic of Brazil at a special ceremony held at Diwan-I-Am, Taj Mahal Hotel on 4th June 2007.

xiv) Library

The personal collection of books and manuscripts bequeathed by Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the Founder President of the Council, forms the core of the ICCR Library. A catalogue of the manuscripts and personal books of Maulana Azad has been printed in book form in three languages - Arabic, Urdu and Persian. The Council also undertook an exercise to preserve the rare manuscripts available with it. Over the decades, the library has grown manifold and presently has more than 50,000 volumes.

The ICCR LIBRARY FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME:

xv) Administration

The list of list of Statutory Bodies of the Council is given at Annexure-XII-XIII-XIV.

The Regional Offices continue to function in Bangalore, Chandigarh, Chennai, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Lucknow, Mumbai, Thiruvananthapuram and Jaipur. The activities of the Regional Offices included coordination with local bodies/organizations & providing assistance to foreign students studying under the Council's scholarships schemes. The Regional Offices also extended logistic facilities to incoming and outgoing cultural delegations & the Council's distinguished visitors.

During the year 2007-08, the Council also opened two new Regional Offices in Pune and Varanasi. Efforts are being made to open new Regional Offices in Shillong, Cuttack and Guwahati in line with recommendations of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on External Affairs.
