HINDI VISHWA

The "Hindi Vishwa", a unique initiative of the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR), is a programme that recognizes the importance of Hindi Language. Its aim is to promote Hindi globally and facilitate cultural and academic exchanges among international students of Hindi.

The first visit under this program, which took place from May 20 to May 29, 2023, welcomed 31 delegates from countries like South Africa, Russia, Mauritius, Fiji, Tajikistan, Tanzania, Sri Lanka, South Korea, Japan, Australia, Poland, Kazakhstan, and Italy. These young scholars, from countries where Hindi is taught, were hosted by ICCR to help them to understand India's rich traditions, cultural heritage, and developmental initiatives.

The Hindi Vishwa programme comprised of a unique blend of academic sessions led by experts and visits to culturally significant sites. During their ten-day visit, the delegates had a series of activities lined up. They explored significant places such as the Red Fort, Pradhanmantri Sangrahalay (Prime Minister's Museum), and the National School of Drama. At Delhi University, they attended interactive sessions with Dr. Sanjeev Tiwari on India's democratic tradition and with Dr. Hitesh Shankar on the journey from independence to prosperity over past 75 years.



The delegates also had the opportunity to visit the Taj Mahal and the Red Fort in Agra. Furthermore, they toured the National Crafts Museum in New Delhi, which houses an impressive collection of 33,000 objects accumulated over six decades. Additionally, a special evening concert titled "A Song Eternal Lata Mangeshkar" paid tribute to the legendary singer, whose melodious voice travels beyond language and cultural barriers. The delegates further visited the Mahatma Gandhi Antarrashtriya Hindi Vishwa Vidyalaya in Wardha, Maharashtra. They attended sessions led by experts that emphasized the importance of Hindi.

Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi has stated that Hindi brings India special honour globally, with its simplicity and sensitivity captivating people's hearts. Hindi serves as a bridge connecting traditional knowledge, ancient civilization, and modern progress. Thus, the "Hindi Vishwa of ICCR" aims to promote cultural and academic exchange on a global scale through the medium of Hindi.
